Their last studio album, *Painting Of A Panic Attack*, hit the top 20 in 2016, achieving the best critical reception of the band's career to date.



Faith Mussa - One of Malawi's most gifted musicians will be bringing his country's only one-man-band set up, combining loop pedal technology with traditional instruments, including the badza (a type of kazoo made from a gourd) and ndani (thumb piano).

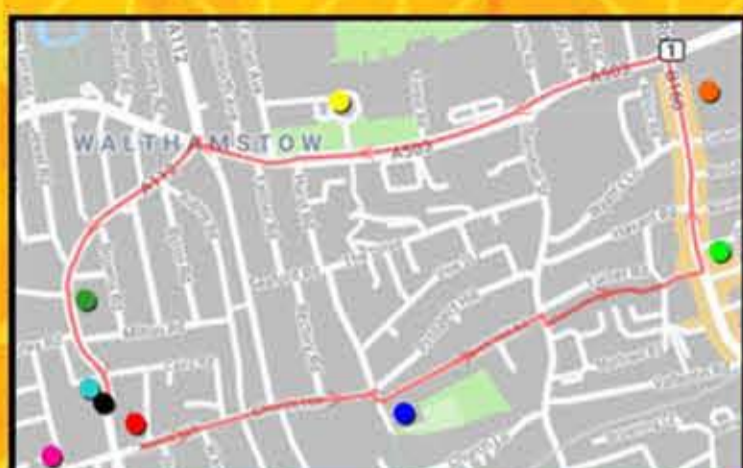

Alim Kamara - Ekcovision. Award-winning local hip-hop artist and story-teller Alim raps in both English and Krio. His poetic lyrics span topics as diverse as social change and his love for Africa.

Setondji Spirit - Rose & Crown Pub French singer / song-writer Setondji Spirit plays roots world music inspired by classical Indian & traditional African melody and rhythms, with a twinkling country folk reggae vibe!

Family drumming workshop - Woodside School. Walthamstow based African performing & visual arts organisation Mbilla Arts are hosting their popular crafts, singing and drumming workshops for children. Drop-in (limited places available).

Nkomba - The Duke Pub. Nkomba play an energetic mixture of Malawian folk songs and African roots music. The band is led by Ron Nkomba who plays guitar, mandolin and harmonica and sings in English & Chichewa.

Lilongwe Shorts - Empire Cinema, screen 5. Malawi's international short film festival comes to E17! Featuring short films from African directors, playing in a loop every hour on the hour.
